To celebrate and acknowledge 40 years of community engagement, I am delighted to present the Advance 40th Anniversary Impact Report.


From a humble beginning, when we opened our doors on May 26, 1980 Advance has grown from having two staff and one site, to a successful, multi-faceted organisation with three sites and more than 35 staff.

As I reflect on the past four decades I think how fortunate and privileged Advance has been to not only survive but, thrive in the face of many challenges. We have continued to built resilience and strength underpinned by our founding philosophy of providing support to those who need it the most.

The Mornington Peninsula is generally seen as a retirement, tourism area with particular areas being quite affluent. There are, however, areas that are highly, socio-economically disadvantaged. We have strategically located our sites across the Peninsula to positively impact on these communities.

Acting as a conduit between government and our community, we have been successful in a significant number of government tenders both at State and Federal levels that has ensured the commitment to our community is effective and sustained.

Since 1980, Advance has delivered a range of key, government initiatives from Community Youth Support Scheme (CYSS) and SkillShare in the eighties to Employment Services and Work Experience programs in the nineties to preparatory, pre-accredited and accredited training over the last 25 years.



More recently in 2016, the establishment of Advance College, a Special Assistance school, has been a major expansion to our operations. It has provided an alternative education setting for those young people who would often be at risk of not completing their secondary education.

Looking back over the last 40 years I can identify a number of key success factors that have been critical for our organisation. We have had great staff with good governance and strong local knowledge. Combined with this is the importance we have placed on partnering and networking with industry and other providers to create effective and efficient synergies.





Vocational Education




Since 2014, a concerted effort has been made to expand the traineeship and apprenticeship offerings.

The move to focus on this area has increased the engagement of Advance with industry, which has allowed us to react quickly to industry needs and demands, and build strong and sustainable relationships with employers.

Apprenticeships now account for the majority of our training delivery, which has been strengthened by the introduction of a School Based Apprenticeships and Traineeships (SBAT) program. Advance has delivered the SBAT program in Certificate II in Parks and Gardens since 2015, and to date, has delivered training to more than 600 trainees with a successful completion rate greater than 90%. Many of these trainees have gone on to further studies or employment, including apprenticeships within the Horticultural sector.

Demand in the Community Services sector continues to increase, with many of our participants completing the Certificate III in Individual Support and subsequently gaining successful, employment outcomes in Aged Care. As a result of building employer relationships over the last six years, we are proud to have achieved strong growth in the number of traineeships in this highly competitive sector.

Industry Sector Delivery



Our short courses continue to deliver strong employment outcomes, with Food Handling, Responsible Service of Alcohol and Barista training always proving popular. These short courses enable our job seekers to gain vital skills for the local hospitality industry, which is one of the largest employers on the Mornington Peninsula.

Another area of continued growth is our delivery of the Certificate IV in Transport and Logistics (Road Transport - Car Driving Instruction). Delivered for more than five years, 97% of our participants successfully complete the qualification, with the majority of graduates going on to employment in the industry, either working for driving schools, or establishing their own businesses in their local communities.

Pathways



Advance has provided pathways for its learners since it began.

Whether it be a pathway to further learning opportunities, a pathway to an employment outcome or a short course to get a job, we take great pride in our ability to support learners on their chosen journey.


Accommodating all levels of ability, we have established basic, preparatory programs for new learners graduating to pre-accredited then accredited learning. Often with an aim to gain employment, our individualised pathways are mapped to local industry and nationally accredited qualifications.

Supported by our vocational guidance staff, a range of opportunities have been provided over many years including the delivery of skill based programs designed to be flexible to meet learners needs and support them to return to study, improve their literacy and numeracy skills, gain a qualification, broaden their employment options and learn new skills.

The primary purpose of our pre-accredited education and training is to provide opportunities that engage and initiate vocational pathways for the most educationally disadvantaged learners.

Pre-accredited courses address the particular needs of adults who have experienced barriers to education in the past and find it difficult to undertake accredited courses as their first step into vocational training, particularly those learners who have not achieved Year 12 or an equivalent qualification.
